



## **About General Semantics (GS):-**

- the study of the structure of symbol systems (particularly language) and how it affects thought and actions.
- how we perceive, construct, evaluate and communicate our life experiences,
- the inter-related effects of language and symbols on our attitudes and behaviours,
- an interdisciplinary system with practical applicatic
   for everyday living,
- a methodology of guided awareness to better understand and evaluate our experiences and reactions.
- a point of view that applies a scientific way of thinking to the challenges of everyday problemsolving.
- a teachable framework for critical thinking, media literacy and personal responsibility.

#### **General Semantics arises from:-**

- the work of Alfred Korzybski, a Polish Count, engineer and military officer, and an extraordinary observer of human behaviour. He survived the horrific battlegrounds of World War I and wondered why humans could progress and advance in some areas, but not in others. He theorised that the attitudes and methodologies responsible for advancements in engineering, the sciences, and mathematics could be applied to the daily affairs of individuals, and ultimately cultures. He called this new field General Semantics and introduced it as a practical, teachable system in his groundbreaking 1933 book, Science and Sanity. This work is a fundamental building block in diverse disciplines including RET and NLP.
- many other books and works by authors exploring the human condition and contemporary issues,
- university courses, industrial and commercial training programmes, and ongoing academic research in USA, Europe, India, Australia and elsewhere.

#### The Institute of General Semantics ...

- was founded in 1938 by Alfred Korzybski to enhance and promote GS as a useful discipline, to foster study and practice of the principles and formulations,
- conducts courses, conferences, seminars and workshops to promote the sharing of ideas and experiences of GS practitioners, and introduce the discipline to others who may benefit from its use,
- publishes books, quarterly and annual journals, and maintains internet sites and resources for use by members.
- in "Special Consultative Status" with the United Nations as a Non-Government organisation.



### **Australian General Semantics Society:-**

- Was founded over 20 years ago by Laurie Cox and Andrew Lohrey.
- is affiliated with the (international) Institute of General Semantics, communicating with practitioners globally, sharing ideas, experiences and resources.
- meets regularly to conduct discussions and weekend seminars, sharing experiences and insights, communicating with GS practitioners globally and studying GS materials.
- is in Association with the United Nations DPI / NGO (Department of Public Information / Non-Government organisations). This relationship entails having effective information programmes in place and the ability and means to disseminate information about the work of the United Nations.
- will be representing the IGS at the UN Conference on Global Health in Melbourne 30 August to 1 September 2010, following our AGS National Conference.


#### Our Presenters ...


